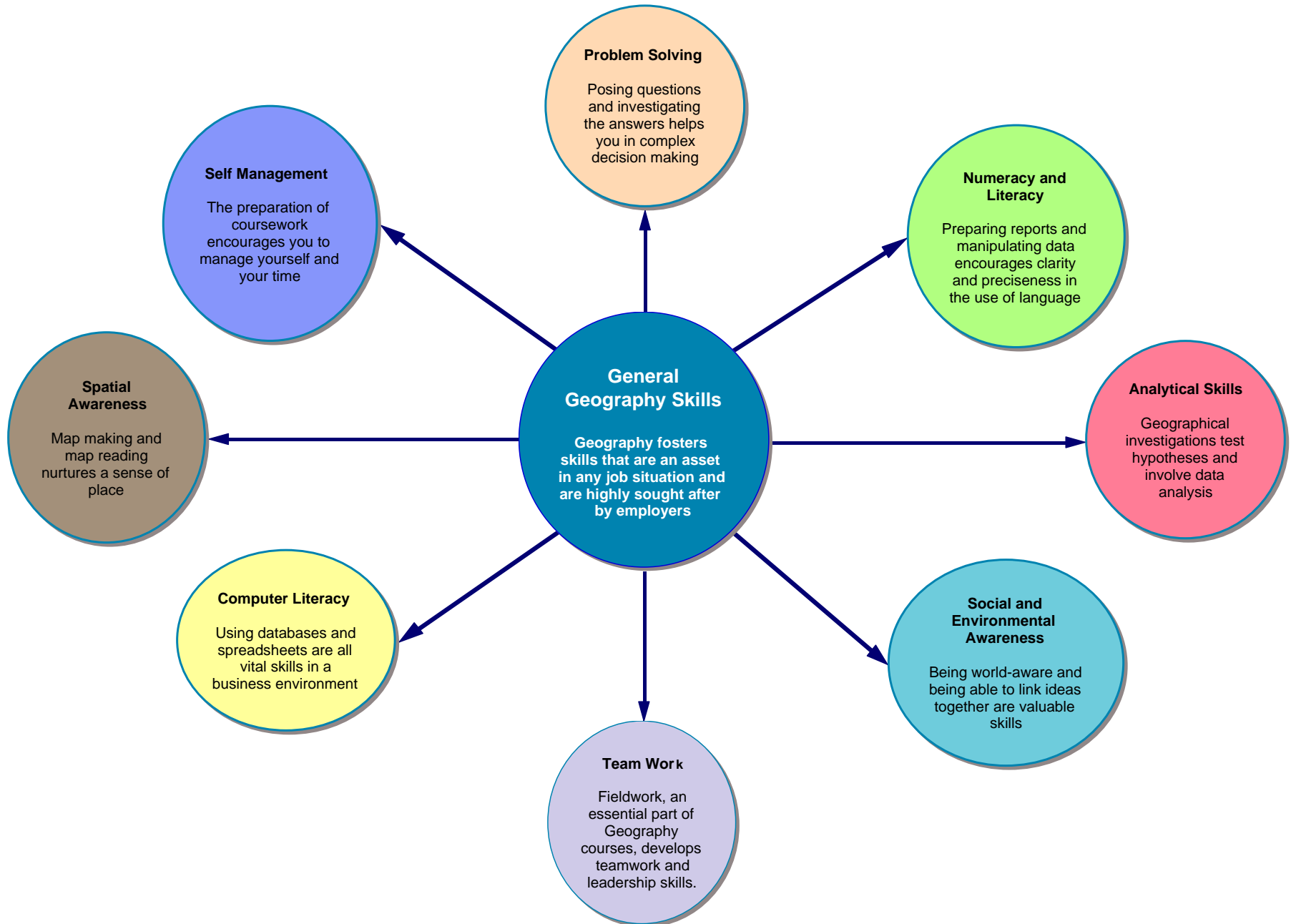

You might become an Economic Developer, a Transport manager, a Location Analyst, a Retailer, a Regional Developer



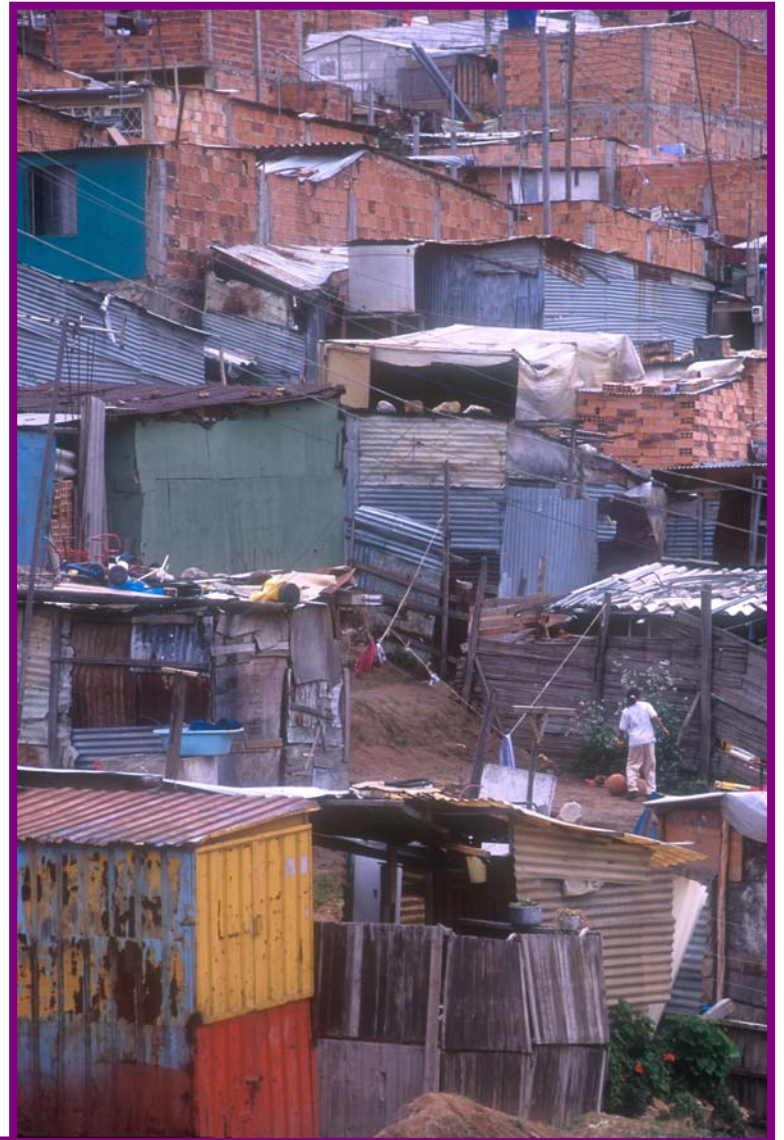
In Geography you will learn about the types and location of economic activity locally, nationally and globally
